

III. BUTCHER'S SHOP, SO CALLED MASARNIA

The steady increase in demand for cold cuts prompted the relocation of Józef Ślęczka's former shop from 1 Jagiellońska Street in 1958 to the Pociasek building at 38 3 Maja Street, which offered more space. This location remained in use for several years. At that time, 70% of the city's stores operated in cramped, leased premises.

In 1973, a modern butcher's shop opened in a former poultry hatchery on the ground floor of 2 Witosa Street. Many older residents of Błazowa fondly remember the taste of the cold cuts, even though the selection was not as varied as it is today. The long queues outside the shop on delivery days remain a vivid memory for them.
