

V. GRAIN WAREHOUSE – NOW THE LIBRARY

According to library records dating back to 1962, the Błażowa library has changed locations several times. It was housed in its current single-story building from 4 December 1959 until 19 October 1964, after being moved from the Praesidium of the M.R.N. (now known as the Town Hall). Following that, the library was relocated back to the ground floor of the Praesidium M.R.N. building, where it occupied three rooms.

In 1972, the library returned to its previous location. The building that housed the library had a varied history: it was once a Jewish inn, later a grain warehouse. Also, it served as the headquarters for both the Public Roads District and the Municipal Housing and Urban Development Authority in Błażowa. This building required extensive renovations.

In 1982, Danuta Heller joined the Błażowa library and became its director. Renovations began in 1985, and the library was subsequently moved to the old kindergarten building, which also needed renovations. On 25 March 1988, the newly renovated library officially opened, and at that time, it was considered one of the most beautiful buildings in Błażowa.

Unfortunately, over the years, the building has suffered from the ravages of time. Minor renovations have been undertaken when possible, including replacing the 16-year-old boiler, windows, and doors. It wasn't until 29 October 2018 that the thermal modernisation of the library building, which had been in disrepair for many years, began, thanks to the efforts of Mayor Jerzy Kocój.
